Undertake the teaching of Journalism courses	 Undertake the teaching of journalism courses, ensuring learning outcomes are met. Teach student-led sessions in a creative way that accurately reflects the advertised programme and meets the overall requirements of the curriculum offer. Create an enriched and exciting learner environment through the aid of digital technologies and resources that enhance learners' studies. Develop teaching materials that derive from a global perspective and are relevant to a diverse student group. Work co-operatively within the programme area team. Provide and work to a course outline, schemes of learning, and lesson plans that are sensitive to the strengths and challenges of learners and that evidence clear learning outcomes. Take responsibility for classroom administration, e.g., take registers and record achievement. 			
Assessment of Students	 Support students to overcome barriers to learning. Assess students' learning during the class, give them feedback and correct homework as required. Take responsibility for classroom administration, e.g., take registers and check students' enrolment status, etc. Carry out quality assurance procedures such as student self-assessment (statements of learning), course review and evaluation procedures. Take responsibility for students' progress and encourage progression to other courses. 			
Other	 Use IT as appropriate to facilitate effective learning. Prepare IT and audio-visual equipment/resources for classes with guidance and support from IT department. Advise students on progression routes to other courses etc. Attend relevant training/development events and meetings as required.
