- Level 2 qualifications in both Literacy and Numeracy (or equivalent).
- A qualification relevant to the subject being taught.
- Have up to date knowledge, enthusiasm and interest for the subject.
- Have an understanding and experience of promoting Health & Safety, Equality & Diversity and customer care.
- Undertake continuing professional development.

- Experience of teaching Python, ideally to groups of adults.
- Can support students by means of differentiating a lesson appropriately.
- Experience of using Zoom for teaching online (desirable).
- Experience of using VLEs, e.g. Google Classroom (desirable).
- Can inspire students to achieve.
- Can support students to overcome barriers to learning.
- Can support the process of quality improvement and understand your role in it
- Share best practice and learn from other colleagues.
- Can raise the profile of your course(s) at City Lit.
- Take responsibility for students' progress and inspire them to re-enrol.
- Can communicate effectively and listen to others.
- Can work in a collaborative way, and effectively as part of a team.
